

Dearest Colleagues,



#### Keynote Address

## Richard Blanco

National Humanities Medal Recipient President Obama's Inaugural Poet 2013 Lambda Literary Award for Memoir



We're thrilled that our keynote speaker this year is poet Richard Blanco! Richard's keynote address will touch on how he moved from working as civil engineer to becoming an awardwinning and nationally recognized poet.

Selected by President Obama as the fifth Presidential Inaugural Poet in U.S. history, Richard Blanco was the youngest, the first Latinx, immigrant, and gay person to serve in that role. In 2023, Blanco was awarded the National Humanities Medal by President Biden from the National Endowment for the Humanities.

Born in Madrid to Cuban exile parents and raised in Miami in a working-class family, Blanco's personal negotiation of cultural identity and the universal themes of place and belonging characterize Blanco's many collections of poetry, including his most recent, *Homeland of My Body*. He has also authored the memoirs For All Of Us, One Today: An Inaugural Poet's Journey and The Prince of Los Cocuyos: A Miami Childhood. Currently, he serves as Education Ambassador for The Academy of American Poets and is an Associate Professor at Florida International University. In April 2022, Blanco was appointed the first-ever Poet Laureate of Miami-Dade County.

**Attend Sessions**: Participate in sessions where you can meet others with similar interests. This creates a natural environment for discussion.

Maximize Opportunities: Use breaks, mealtimes, and networking events to approach people. These settings can be more relaxed and conducive to making connections.

**Be Mindful of Your Surroundings**: Pay attention to people standing alone or looking for someone to talk to. Approaching them can lead to a mutually beneficial connection.

**Be Genuine and Authentic**: Focus on building real relationships rather than just collecting contacts. Show interest in others' work and share your own experiences.

**Follow Up On-the-Spot**: If you meet someone interesting, suggest connecting on social right away or exchanging contact information to keep the momentum going.




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
